

- Desktop
- Laptop
- Netbook
- Tablet PC
- Smartphone

Desktops



- System cost
 - · Entry: \$350 to \$500
 - · Mid-range < \$1K
 - · Power: \$1.5 K \$2K
- Dell or HP are solid
- Intel CPU's prevalent
- Choose "White Box" computers carefully
- Customize wisely

Laptops

- Dual-core processors a must for multitasking
- 16 inch screen can display a true 1080p (1920by-1080-pixel resolution) picture – need HDMI
- Skimping on battery quality may cost dearly
- Buy a USB mouse designed for laptops
- Screen coating may effect outdoor usage
- Ethernet port is still important
- Docking stations are not just for work

Netbooks



- Inexpensive (\$300 500) & portable
- Screen sizes of 12 inches or smaller
- Internet use and light word processing
- Run Windows XP
- Intel Atom processor

Operating systems

- Windows
 - Windows XP
 - Windows Vista
 - Windows 7
- Apple Mac OS 10.6 ("Snow Leopard")
- Linux Ubuntu, Red Hat, SUSE
- Key question: Will there be <u>driver</u> support for my printer, monitor, scanner, etc.?

Windows XP, Vista, or 7

- XP best selling OS for nearly 5 years; but it came out in 2001 and <u>mainstream</u> support ran out in 4-2009
- Just say no to Vista
 - Aero environment is a resource hog
 - Windows 7 is now out as of 10-2009
 - UAC not implemented well
- Windows 7 is getting favorable reviews and will run on hardware that Vista won't

Processor (CPU)



Intel

- Celeron (ugh!)
- Atom
- Dual-Core
- Core 2 Duo
- Quad-Core
- Core I7
- AMD
 - Athlon 64 X2
 - K10

Memory (RAM)



- DIMMS
- 32 bit OS 4 GB max
- 64 bit OS over 4GB
- Maximizing RAM is one of the cheapest ways of increasing performance of a PC

Hard drive



- Long-term storage
 - 160 750 GB
 - 1 TB
- Drive speed is important
 - 5,400 RPM is average
 - 7,200 RPM is fastest

Graphics adapter


- Integrated on motherboard; or
- Separate internal plug-in card
- Video ram (VRAM) of 512 MB 1 GB essential for PC gaming
- Ouputs
 - VGA or DVI to computer monitor
 - HDMI to HDTV

Monitor



- CRT now obsolete
- LCD sizes range from 17 – 24 inches and larger
- Some 26 inch HDTV's can double as a monitor – check for VGA, DVI, and HDMI connections

- Home office: integrated sound ok
- Multimedia PC
 - Dolby 5.1 or 7.1
 - Surround sound
 - '0.1' is subwoofer
- Content still should be DVD or Blu-ray

Networking



- Ethernet
- Wi-Fi
 - Class of wireless local area network (WLAN)
 - 802.11 b,g,n
- 3g
 - "mobile broadband"
 - Verizon, AT&T

External storage


- Floppy drive (1.44 MB) (rare in new PC's)
- CD-RW (700 MB)
- DVD-RW (4-8 GB)
- Blu-ray disc (50 GB)
- USB flash drive (1 GB 64 GB)
- External USB HD (160 GB 2 TB)

Software

 - MS Office 2007
 - Adobe Acrobat Pro
 - Symantec
- The Bad
 - Bloatware
 - Trialware

- Tower
